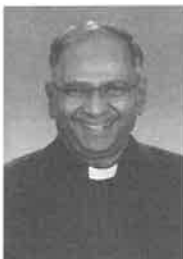

Heart to Heart Chat – 4.20.2025

My dear Friends,
I wish you a Happy Easter and may the Peace of the Risen Lord fill your hearts and bring you the power of the Resurrection.

St. John Henry Newman makes a distinction between notional and real assent to a credal proclamation. A notional assent means that we understand the terms of a statement. But a real assent is one when we recognize how our whole being or selves are implicated by the assent. When we acknowledge in our faith that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, then everything must change. Resurrection did change everything in the lives of Jesus' disciples. When Mary Magdalene ran to the tomb and did not find the body of Jesus, she was desolate. Peter and John who saw the empty tomb did not know what to make out of it. They had never experienced Resurrection in human history and thus could not grasp the meaning of the Resurrection. Here comes the merciful encounter the Risen Lord decided to offer to the disciples. Jesus appears many times with the new risen body and shows his new risen glory to the disciples. Even to Thomas he let him touch the side wound and come to understand the meaning of his resurrection. When he met Peter and other disciples on the shore of Galilee, he waited with a meal prepared for them. He mercifully embraces Peter and reinstate him to continue his ministry for the Lord. All the post resurrection encounters of Jesus with his disciples affirm the extraordinary and unique meaning of the Resurrection in the life of the disciples. Thus, the Risen Lord totally transformed the lives of his disciples. As precarious as our life is today, we are still encouraged by the Risen Lord to look at life differently. Just think about the glorified body of Christ that is devoid of human weariness, pain, suffering and anything that could oppress human body. If we are all going to inherit the same glorified body through Christ, then we can live our lives with greater enthusiasm and joy for our Lord. For in him death and sin are defeated. The power of sin to control our lives is also decimated. What else are we worried in choosing to live a life worthy of the Risen Lord? If we trust in the transforming power of His Resurrection, everything in our life can be viewed differently. Everything can be understood well in the light of His Resurrection. He offers us the courage and strength to be his true witnesses of his Resurrection that we are no more notional believers but real believers. *Happy Easter to you all.*
