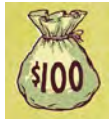

Heart to Heart Chat – 1.19.2025

My dear friends,

A young monk went to the abbot and asked him an important question. I have been very faithful to my prayer life. I observe all the rules of the monastery sincerely. I sacrifice my time and help others in the community work. I fast regularly. Despite all my sincere following of the monastic life, I still miss something. I am not happy with my life. What should I do? The abbot raised all his fingers heavenwards and spoke firmly, “Just be-

come all flames.” The abbot’s advice to the young monk is nothing but, why don’t you become all love. There is no part in which you can be other than love.

Is it possible for us humans to be always all loving and all kind? Why do we constantly experience inner conflicts that lead us to restlessness, and we tend to create conflict outside us too? St. James offers us an insight about our inner spiritual wars: “Where do the conflicts among you come from? Is it not from your passions that make war within your members? You covet but do not possess. You kill and envy, but you cannot obtain; you fight and wage war.” In all the inner wars we go through in our life come from our tendency to walk away from genuine love. Love always seeks the good of others. It desires to offer the best help to others. Love never becomes so possessive. It frees others to live their life with true freedom. Love doesn’t seek to covet anything to oneself. It rejoices in giving away things that are so useful to others. Love does not promote what is evil and destructive. It offers great things that are constructive and helpful to the growth of the other person. Love is not jealous, and it never seeks to obstruct the growth of another person. It never creates disunity among others because true love is always a unifying force. In this way and many other ways, we can check with each one of us every day, how loving and unloving I act every day? Whenever there is less joy and peace in our hearts, we can be certain that there is less love in our life. We seek God’s help when we fail to bring love in our daily dealings. It is humanly impossible to be a loving person all the time. However, with the **Life-Giving Spirit of Christ** that is constantly given to us through the Holy Eucharist, we can always move toward the goal of being a loving person all the time. By diffusing the power of love, we can positively transform our own lives and that of everyone around us. That is the prime ministry Christ has commissioned us to do. Let us strive constantly to become the loving person God has called us to be.
